Class 107 Junior Handler – 5 - 10 years old on show day.

All competitors to receive a rosette

Class 108 Junior Handler – 11 - 16 years old on show day.

All competitors to receive a rosette

Class 109 Pet Females/Wethers – aged 8 weeks to 1 year.

Pets are defined as Wethers and Pet females not eligible to registration in the Pygmy Goat Club Herd Book.

Class 110 Pet Females/Wethers - 1-2 years of age.

Pets are defined as wethers and females not eligible to registration in the Pygmy Goat Club Herd Book.

Class 111 Pet Females/Wethers - 2 years and over.

Pets are defined as wethers and females not eligible to registration in the Pygmy Goat Club Herd Book.

Class 112 Female Kid - 8weeks - 1year of age on the day of the show.

Class 113 Goatling – 1-2 years of age on the day of the show, not to have borne a kid.

Class 114 Adult Female - 2-6 years of age on the day of the show.

Class 115 Veteran Female - 7 years of age and over.

Class 116 Male Kid - 8 weeks – 1 year of age on the day of the show.

Class 117 Buckling - 1-2 years of age on the day of the show.

Class 118 Adult Male - 2 years of age and over.

Class 119 Sire and Progeny – To have been shown in classes 99-105, at least two progeny must be shown.

Class 120 Dam and Progeny – Both to have been shown in progeny in classes 99-105

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Show Rules

1. Judging to commence at approximately 9.30 am for dairy cattle, 10.30am for sheep and beef cattle with goats at approximately 9.30am.
 2. No exhibitor to remove their entry until 4pm.
 3. Closing date for entries is 8pm on 18th August 2026. Late entries may be accepted. Please contact the secretary.
 4. Exhibitors to comply with the regulations of DEFRA. This must include completing form FM/AW27 confirming cleaning and disinfecting of vehicles on return from show. Exhibitors must inform a steward or committee member of any potential illness in their animals.
 5. Any exhibitors wishing to lodge an objection regarding an exhibit in the show, must do so in writing to the Secretary within ONE HOUR of the end of the judging, with a deposit of £5, which will be retained by the society if the objection is overruled but refunded if it is upheld. The Chief Steward to have final say in the case of dispute.
 6. All entries must have been in the ownership of the exhibitor for at least 28 days prior to the show.
 7. Exhibits in the sheep section must be shown outside the pen to be judged.
 8. If there are less than two exhibitors in a class then the points for that class will be halved. In the event of a tie the Chief Steward will have the final decision.
 9. In the event of a tie in the Cattle, Sheep and Goat section, competitors must agree to keep the cup for 6 months each. All cups are perpetual and any cup won 3 years in succession or 5 years in all, a replica will be given.
 10. The Society reserves the right to refuse entries.
 11. Horses, cattle, sheep, goats and property will be considered as being in the exhibitor's sole charge. The committee will not be responsible for damage, loss or injury owing to accident or from any other cause.
 12. Cows or Heifers calving at the show or which have signs of abnormal discharge will be placed into isolation and returned to the herd of origin as soon as is practical. If calving takes place or abnormal discharge occurs before the time of judging, such animals will not be allowed to compete.
 13. No animals will be admitted to the show unless accompanied by the correct papers.
 14. Sheep and goat entries from Sheep and Goat Heath Scheme Flocks, must be accompanied by a green SAC valid certificate of status.
 15. Only catalogued entries to be shown.
 16. The Society reserves the right to amalgamate or divide classes accordingly.
 17. With regards to the goat section:-
 - The Pygmy Goat classes will be run under the ruling of the Pygmy Goat Club.
 - No goat must be brought to the show in kid or has kidded within 30 days of the show.
 - No goat can be entered if previously owned or bred by the judge.
- All dates to be calculated at the date of the show.
18. All stock must be accompanied by a current AML Movement Licence.

19. All entrants to comply with the show Health & Safety Policy a full copy of which is available to download from the website.
