DROP OFF & ENTER YOUR EXHIBIT: The Horticultural marquee will be OPEN on Friday 29th Aug 4pm-6pm & Saturday 30th Aug 8am-10:30am (important: drop off closing earlier than previous years)

Please note: The latest time to enter your exhibit is on the show day at 10:30am.

Please note: Although there is 24 hour security on the show field Friday and Saturday, items are left at your own risk.

JUDGING: The marquee will close to public at 10:30-12:30pm and judging will commence.

RESULTS: Will be revealed when the marquee reopens from 12:30pm onwards.

PUBLIC VIEWING OPENS: 12:30-4pm. Opening earlier than previous years.

Please note: No exhibits to be removed before 4pm as the marquee is open for public viewing.

PRIZE MONEY: All 1st place winners can collect their prize money from the Horticultural marquee anytime from 12:30-5pm on the day.

(If fewer than 4 exhibits are entered into any class, prize money for 1st place will not be awarded)

RESERVE YOUR EXHIBITS: If you do not wish for your exhibit to be included in The Grand Auction at 4pm, please place a RED DOT STICKER sticker on your item. Stickers will be available from the Horticultural marquee.

Important: Any exhibits without a red dot will be assumed to be kindly donated and will be auctioned during 'The Grand Auction', held in the marquee at 4pm.

The auction will be hosted by Graham Watkins & Co., with all proceeds supporting the Ipstones Agricultural Society and the 2026 show.
